In this week's Epistle from First Timothy, we read, "First of all, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for everyone, for kings and all who are in high positions, so that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and dignity." I recently heard a lecturer present how our Anglican/Episcopal way of being Christian is both blessed and haunted by the fact that we are the established church in England and the church of the establishment in the United States. Well, maybe not so much any more in the United States, but the Washington National Cathedral remains, as I often say, "brought to you by the Episcopal Church." What to make of this? What is the proper relationship of Christianity to the civil government? Some scriptures point toward a respectful acknowledgement, if not submission to, the authority of earthly governments. And yet this must be held in tension with the fact that Jesus, Peter, and Paul were all executed, along with many others. In the Acts of the Apostles, Peter says to the governing council, "We must obey God rather than any human

authority." All of this is complicated

IMPLICIT BIAS WORKSHOP WITH DR. URSULINE R. BANKHEAD

On September 28 from 9 am to noon, the Diocese of Western New York's Commission to Dismantle Racism and Discrimination will host a workshop on implicit bias at St. Luke's, Jamestown. Registration and breakfast will begin at 8:30 a.m.

The workshop, which is recommended for clergy, church leaders, vestries and church educators, will

be led by Dr. Ursuline R. Bankhead, a member of the commission and member of Trinity, Buffalo. Bishop Sean will open the day with remarks. No pre-registration is required and members of the community are welcome. According to the commission, implicit bias impacts every person regardless of race, culture, age, gender identity, ability status, or belief system. Bankhead's interactive presentation will provide definitions of bias and implicit bias; clarify how implicit bias impacts everyone personally, culturally, and spiritually; and help participants recognize the impact of implicit bias.

Bankhead is a native of Buffalo and a graduate of Buffalo Public Schools. She earned her undergraduate degree in psychology from Penn State University; her masters degree in marriage and family therapy from East Carolina University; and her doctoral degree in counseling psychology from the University at Buffalo. She works as a psychologist in Western New York and leads programs and initiatives to address issues of equity and inclusion.
