




Stations of the Cross during Lent

Join St. Mark's and St. Paul's for a


LENTEN BOOK STUDY

Contemplative Compline: March 10 at 7:15 pm



Following the Divine Dance Lenten program, please join us in the Chapel for the Office of Compline. The name comes from the Latin *completorium* or *completion* and it is the final set of prayers said or sung at the end of the day. The service includes psalms, readings from scripture, the Lord's Prayer, the Nunc dimittis, and prayers asking for God's protection through the night. A small schola of singers will chant psalms and canticles to simple plainsong.

Scope of Work:

Primary tasks involve painting, boarding up homes, park improvements, alleyways, neighborhood clean ups, tree trimming, lighting and landscaping.
