

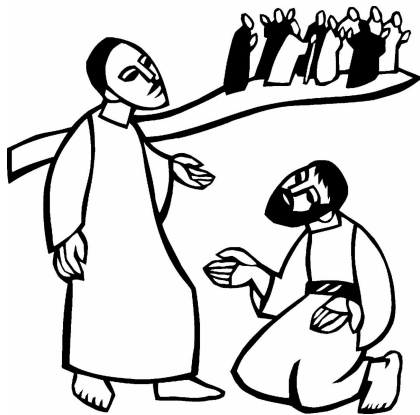

## Ministry to the Homeless

When the cold weather returns, the Emergency Overflow shelter, "Our Neighbor's





Place," located at 1st Presbyterian Church of the Covenant, will open for the 2019-20 season.

The Cathedral will oversee the shelter on the following days:

- December 2 (covering shifts only)
- December 3 (providing meal and covering shifts)
- January 7 (providing meal and covering shifts)
- January 14 (providing meal and covering shifts)

Volunteers are needed to sign up for each of the shifts during the evening:  
7 pm - 11 pm, 11 pm - 3 am, 3 am - 7 am

Cooks are needed to provide entrees, sides or desserts for the meals.
