Hospital Visitation

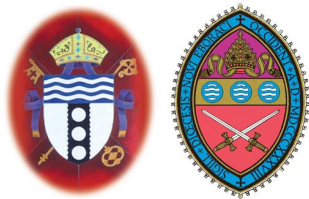
Please remember that it is important to let clergy or congregational leaders know if you are admitted to the hospital as Saint Vincent Hospital
