Ministry to the Homeless



When the cold weather returns, the Emergency Overflow shelter, "Our Neighbor's Place," located at 1st Presbyterian Church of the Covenant, will open for the 2019-20 season.

The Cathedral will oversee the shelter on the following days:

- **December 2** (covering shifts only)
- **December 3** (providing meal and covering shifts)
- **January 7** (providing meal and covering shifts)
- **January 14** (providing meal and covering shifts)

Volunteers are needed to sign up for each of the shifts during the evening:
7 pm - 11 pm, 11 pm - 3 am, 3 am - 7 am

Cooks are needed to provide entrees, sides or desserts for the meals.
